Life App Definition

Wisdom- finding out what you should do and doing it.

Main Idea

We start the month with Jesus and our only glimpse into His life as a child. In Luke 10:1-11, we discover that Jesus knew His father's house was where He needed to be. Jesus grew in wisdom, faith, and friendship, and this is the model we should follow as we seek to grow in our relationships with God.

Memory Verse

If any of you need wisdom, you should ask God for it. He will give to you. God gives freely to everyone and doesn't find fault. James 1:5, NIV

Bottom Line

Wisdom is worth searching for.

Activity Rotation: "Finding Wisdom"

- Supplies Needed:
 - Bowl of letters(Alpha-Bits, dried letter pasta, scrabble tiles)
 - Plastic spoon.
 - Plate
- The point: Kids will race to spell out the word "WISDOM" by searching through a bowl of AlphaBits letters. First team to find all the letters and spell out the word wins. This activity will help teach kids that wisdom is worth searching for.
- Directions:
 - Fill the bowls with the letters.
 - Set the bowl on one side of the room.
 - Have your child stand on the opposite side from the bowl.
 - Give your child a plastic spoon.
 - Instruct them to run to the bowl and use their spoon to dig around and find the first letter in the word "wisdom": W
 - Once your child finds the "W," instruct them to scoop it onto their spoon and run back to the start.

- Instruct them to put the letter on the plate and run back to the bowl to find the letter "I".
- Continue this sequence until all letters of "WISDOM" are found and put in order.
- Share with your child that in this game, wisdom is worth searching for, literally.
- Ask them where would you find wisdom in your normal life when you need it most (Invite answers.)
- Share with them that they can do what Jesus did in our Bible story today ask good questions to people who have a lot of wisdom like leaders here at church or adults at their school. They can even talk to their grown-ups at home. If the leaders at church, adults at school, or grownups at home don't know the wisest answer to your questions, they will do their best to help you and find out. They can also read the Bible. It is of wisdom
- Ask your child to share one wise thing they have learned from the Bible. (Invite answers.)
- Optional discussion questions for 4rd- 5th graders:
 - Where are you about the age that Jesus was in our story. What do you think he wanted wisdom about
 - If you could ask any leader or teacher for wise advice, who would it be What would you ask
 - How do you know if you or someone else is wise What does it mean to be wise
